law had recently passed away at a young age leaving a wife and young children, and I did not want to embarrass them.


You all dug deep and the raffle proceeds were more that had ever been raised, even though you had no idea where the money was going. Thank you all for digging deep into your pockets and making this happen.

19th ANNUAL KELLY COUNTRY PICK 18th to 20th AUGUST

The Kelly Country Pick is a winter Bluegrass and Old Time Country Music Convention based in the historic town of Beechworth. It began in 1999 as an annual get together between a few pickers and families from Victoria and NSW for a relaxed music weekend. It now attracts some 300-500 musicians and patrons and is growing steadily.

The convention is based in the historic 'Old Priory' – a 19th century catholic convent converted into a modern accommodation facility. All the workshops and afternoon concerts are held at the Priory. Evening concerts also take place in the local hotels.

The Kelly Country Pick focuses on 'picking', sharing music, and teaching technical skills, and provides a great opportunity to see some of Australia's foremost bluegrass and ol timey musicians both in concert and in informal 'sessions'.
