MAY 5th SNOWY MOUNTAIN RAMBLERS


The Snowy Mountain Ramblers formed about 18 months ago after sitting around picking at Guildford Banjo Jamboree.

Guitarist Rob Lewis has been around the bluegrass scene for 30 years or more, playing in such bands as the Melbourne Bluegrass Band, the Last Gasp Bluegrass Band and Doctor Fosters

Bluegrass Band. Rob is an excellent vocalist and one of Melbourne's leading flatpickers. Frank Scholtz says he couldn't get enough bluegrass in Germany so he emigrated here to find some more. He is one of Australia's top Scruggs-style banjo players and had played in such bands as Country Grass and recently in the Over-the Hillbillies. He's definitely not over the hill!

David Aumann, on mandolin, came to bluegrass only 7 or 8 years ago, and has played with Indigo Rye, Fat Chance and currently also plays in Faux Grass. He sings lead on a few songs but for the most part is a very solid harmony singer.

The Snowy Mountain Ramblers' material is fairly traditional bluegrass, featuring songs by

If you were around 'back then' (or wish you were), and think fondly of the particular songs & issues from that pivotal time, then come celebrate on May 12th.

Ireland's most famous and successful duo return to Australia in 2013. Mick Foster and Tony Allen have been performing together for over 30 years. They first toured Australia in 1983 and this will be their 18th trip down under.

These charismatic singers have been performing their unique blend of easy listening and folk music and their popularity is proven with their record sales. After 30 years, their popularity continues to flourish and fans often travel long distances to catch their shows as they tour around the country


