

NEVER DOUBT THE POWER OF MUSIC.

In another life, for over 25 years, I was a full time professional photographer. The type of photography varied but a large percentage of this was working in pre-schools, this involved the age group of 3-5, and I found it extremely rewarding. As most people are aware I am relatively new to music and at the end of my photography career had only been playing a short time, Three chords on the guitar and a screech out of the violin. The teachers were aware of this and sometimes asked me to bring the instruments and play a few tunes to the children after I had finished photographing.

One particular day stands out over all the hundred of days I spent in that environment. This particular pre-school had a boy that had autism, He was, if fact, so disruptive and destructive that he had a special aid that followed him around to stop him attacking the other children or destroying the classroom. I went and got my instruments out of the car and the children all sat down on the Mat. The teacher said this boy, let's call him Bob, never joined the group at matt time but wandered around the room, with the aid close behind him.

I played a few songs and all the children joined in and I noticed that Bob would turn around now and then and look at me. Then after a while he came over to the mat and quietly sat down behind the other children. His aid sat down close behind him ready to grab him should he attack the other children. But he didn't in fact, he just sat quietly and joined the group. After ten minutes I looked over at him and noticed that the special aid had tears running down her cheeks. (She told me later that she had been working with Bob for months and this was the first time he had ever joined in anything.)

I then pulled out my 100 year old Manby Violin and by showing the children how to operate the bow, I would hold the violin and they would play "twinkle twinkle little star" Boy that boosted their self esteem. Slowly we worked our way through so all of the children had had a turn. Except Bob.

I called him up and I heard this panicked teachers voice whispering in my ear "No! No! he will destroy it". I whispered back that it was my choice. Bob slowly came up to the front and perfectly behaved he played that tune. I thanked him ,got the other children to give him a big clap, and he went back and sat down.

At the end of the session his mother came to collect him, with a series of loud grunts and grabbing her skirt he dragged her across the room pointing at me. "Hi Bob do you want to show your mother how you can play the violin". "Grunt Grunt" was the response. I got it out of the case and he played it for her that made two people cry in one day. I suggested that they introduce a music component to their sessions, I hope they did.


