

the Irish Famines and the uncaring attitude of the British rulers.

## Despairing that there is no good new music for "folkies" out there??? Check out Mumford & Sons

They are an English <u>folk rock</u> band. The band consists of <u>Marcus Mumford</u> (lead vocals, guitar, drums, <u>mandolin</u>), Ben Lovett (vocals, keyboards, accordion, drums), Winston Marshall (vocals, <u>banjo</u>, <u>guitar</u>, <u>resonator guitar</u>), and Ted Dwane (vocals, string bass, drums, guitar). Mumford & Sons formed in December 2007, emerging out of West London, with such artists as <u>Laura Marling</u>, <u>Johnny Flynn</u> and <u>Noah</u> and the Whale.

Mumford & Sons recorded an EP, *Love Your Ground*, and performed in small to moderate venues in the UK and US to expose audiences to their music and build support for an eventual album. Their debut album, *Sigh No More*, was released in the UK and Ireland in October 2009, and February 2010 in the United States. The album reached number one in Ireland, Australia and New Zealand and eventually peaked at number two on the <u>UK Albums Chart</u> and the *Billboard* 200 in the US. The band gained popularity throughout 2010, performing for larger audiences and making their first network television appearances in the US. On 1 December 2010, the band received two Grammy Award nominations, one for Best



New Artist and the other for Best Rock Song ("Little Lion Man"). The ensuing live performance at the Grammy ceremony in February led to increased airplay and popularity for singles from Sigh No More. The band won the ARIA Music Award for Most Popular International Artist in 2010, and the Brit Award in 2011 for Best British Album.

The band's second studio album <u>Babel</u> was released in September 2012. The album debuted at number one in the UK and US, becoming the fastest selling album of 2012 in the UK, and the second-biggest selling debut in 2012 in the US. At the <u>2013 Grammy Awards</u>, <u>Babel</u> won the <u>Grammy Award</u> for <u>Album of the Year</u>.

FolkTrain are Chris Stack, Saskia Adams and Rudy van den Bovenkamp - a trio based in Victoria's Dandenong Ranges, playing original and traditional folk songs and tunes. Guitar, mandolin, banjo, fiddle, accordion, harmonica and pan pipes. The band has played many venues around the Dandenong Ranges and the inner suburbs of Melbourne, and appeared at festivals in Victoria and Tasmania.

As the name **Now and Zen** suggests, their selection of songs encompasses a wide range of music, starting in the 60s and winding through the years to the



current era. They play a selection of covers ranging from jazz to blues, R&B to country rock and reggae. The band comprises consummate musicians who have played with some of this country's best. Keith Pereira on drums, Steve White on guitar and vocals, Jan Bukovsy on keyboards, John Cafarella on bass and vocals, and Mike Carman, the lead vocalist and percussionist.

#### Three Irish Icons Appearing at the 2013 Festival!

The National is delighted that our old friend **Andy Irvine** will be appearing again this Easter and we're positively excited that **Paul Brady**, his former musical collaborator and one of Ireland's greatest singer/song writers will be making his first appearance.

No collection of folk music is complete without a copy of their self-titled 1976 album, recorded after the break up of the super group, Planxty, which featured their stellar talents.

**Brady,** from Strabane Country Tyrone, made his name in the folk group the Johnstons, but went on to make an even bigger name as a singer/songwriter whose works have been performed by the likes of Bonnie Rait, Tina Turner, Art Garfunkel and Santana, to name but a few. His song "The Island" is regarded as one of the greatest anti-war anthems. He moves effortlessly between traditional folk, pop, rock and blues and isn't averse to playing tin whistle or mandolin in a session.

**Andy Irvine** is a frequent visitor to Australia - which he now regards as a second home - and to the National Folk Festival. A mainstay of such famous bands as Sweeney's Men, Planxty, Patrick Street and, more recently, Mozaik, he is a master musician, songwriter and singer. His knowledge and love of Balkan music, with it's complex rhythms, had a major influence on the evolution of how Irish traditional music is played. Andy is another player who has a habit of gravitating, rapidly, to the Session Bar at the end of a gig.

All Ireland Uillean pipe and whistle champion, singer-songwriter, banjo and guitarist and more recently actor **Finbar Furey** will make his first appearance at the National Folk Festival in 2013. After 30 years as the frontman for the Furey Brothers he is now pursuing a solo career and his reputation as a solo artist has increased with every performance. He has toured extensively in Britain, Europe and Australia, treating audiences to evenings of pure Irish magic, great music, good humour, and the charm and sparkling wit associated with one of Ireland's great raconteurs.
