
AT PFC AUG 3RD. NINE MILE CREEK BAND

"TRAVELLING SONGS" THEME NIGHT ON SEPT 7TH


We reckon it's time for another THEME NIGHT with no Guest Act and lots of opportunities for performers to "strut their stuff"


