# AUGUST 2ND..GUEST ACT "INTERLUDE"

<u>INTERLUDE</u> is a duo of Ali Lane and Clark Morgan. Together, with guitars, voices and occasional use of piano, they bring their unique arrangements, based on rhythm and harmony, to the hits of yesteryear. Interlude cover the material of well known artists and songwriters including



Bob Dylan, Stephen Stills, Pete Seeger, James Taylor, Billy Joel, John Denver, etc. with songs of <u>Peace</u>, of <u>Love</u> and of course <u>Heartache</u>.

Although having formed Interlude just over a year ago, both Ali and Clark have extensive experience accumulated over decades of performance.

Ali is of Maori descent and certainly inherited the wonderful voice and ability to harmonise so synonymous with her people. Clark is known to many of our members, being a past treasurer and current life member of PFC. He has performed on countless occasions over 30 years at the club, both solo and in various group ensembles. We saw Clark perform for

us at our 30 year celebrations event, giving us a great mixture of guitar ballads, Bush tunes on the accordion and some piano numbers. Clark won the PFC songwriters competition in 2010 and



was runner up in 2009.

# **OCTOBER** 4TH : TIDAL MOON

"Acoustic ripples upon a sea of imagination" - Classical/Celtic meet Folk/Country. Barbara Jeffrey and José Garcia combine a hybrid Celtic/Paraguayan harp and soaring soprano vocals, with the timbre of José's voice and guitar, to form Tidal Moon. The result is a sound akin to bringing the mountains to the

sea, minus mudslides or any tsunami-like effects.

Occasionally a flute, charango or bodhran get thrown into the mix, so the story can unfold from the sounds of calming seas to the heavy rumble of 'Fionn' tossing basalt cabers. Barbara's classical and Celtic background harpoons José's country-influenced folk to produce a beast that would snare Captain Ahab's attention. Beautiful traditional, original and contemporary music.


