

WHAT'S COMING UP AT PFC???

JULY 5TH... GUEST ARTISTS WILL BEfolkTrain

folkTrain combine Australian and Celtic tradition with original songs, accompanied on a wide range of instruments including guitar, mandolin, banjo, accordion, fiddle, pan pipes, didgeridoo, concertina and harmonica. The band has performed to appreciative audiences at folk clubs and festivals in Victoria and Tasmania, including the Beechworth Celtic Festival, the

Kilmore Celtic Festival, the Tamar Valley Folk Festival and the Maldon Folk Festival. folkTrain comprises Rudy van den Bovenkamp (vocals, fiddle, guitar, accordion, banjo, harmonica and pan pipes), Chris Stack (vocals, tenor banjo and octave mandolin) and Saskia Adams (vocals, fiddle and guitar). Our original songs are written by Chris Stack, who is a prolific and unique songster. Folk clubs and festivals are where Chris's songs really find their mark, since these audiences have a thirst for thought-provoking and/or hilarious story lines, and folkTrain love to bask in listeners' reactions. Saskia adds a touch of class and finesse to the ensemble, and Rudy just tries to vary the instrumentation and to basically have fun and show off! folkTrain acknowledges the pivotal role played by folk clubs and festivals and look forward to gracing your venue.

cluding Bob Dylan, Stephen Stills, Pete Seeger, James Taylor, Billy Joel, John Denver, etc. with songs of <u>Peace</u>, of Love and of course Heartache.

Although having formed Interlude just over a year ago, both Ali and Clark have extensive experience accumulated over decades of performance.

Ali is of Maori descent and certainly inherited the wonderful voice and ability to harmonise so synonymous with her people. Clark is known to many of our members, being a past treasurer and current life member of PFC. He has performed on countless occasions over 30 years at the club, both solo and in various group ensembles. We

saw Clark perform for us at our 30 year celebrations event, giving us a great mixture of guitar ballads, Bush tunes on the accordion and some piano numbers. Clark won the PFC songwriters competition in 2010 and was runner up in 2009.

NATIONAL FOLK FESTIVAL 2015

Report by Robyn Mitchell of "Eat ya Greens"

I have always enjoyed the NFF and 2015 was no exception. It is a festival where involvement is encouraged and celebrated. Some of the variety of participatory activities were the morning 'Uke Muster' and Dru Yoga sessions (too early for the likes of me), the festival choirs and bands, singing sessions, a comprehensive dance program and craft activities. As well as these the Session Bar often buzzed all day and into the next. Groups of singers and players of a variety of styles somehow found space to enjoy what, for many, is their annual catchup of news and tunes. Some of the best music of the festival can be heard in the Session Bar.

Another feature was the number of venues offering opportunities for less experienced performers to add themselves to the blackboard and get up in front of a (often) quite large audience to perform. I got up with group in the Bohemian Bar (a marquee set aside exclusively for 'blackboard' acts) and at the Flute and Fiddle Bar. Many acts

seen at this and other festivals have started off in such places and the 'talent scouts' are always on the lookout.

Because I enjoy being involved, I went as a volunteer on the Stock Camp. This is an area set aside in the Festival grounds where we prepare and serve billy tea, damper, camp oven stew etc. We also provide a stage that this year was graced by, amongst others, Danny Spooner and Ted Egan. It is also a space for the bush poets to strut their stuff. It was no great hardship serving billy tea and damper whilst listening to some wonderful music. The headliner acts were many and varied. Some of my favourites were 'My Friend The Chocolate

My only personal complaint would be that the very loud amplified drumming made sleep, for me, impossible before 2 or 3 am. I found accommodation 'off site' for 2 nights to catch up on some much needed sleep.

The weather was mostly perfect with a substantial amount of rain falling during the final night, but it needed more than that to dampen the spirits of the many at Exhibition Park.
