THE 50th NATIONAL FOLK FESTIVAL, 2016



For five days the reimagined Festival site at Exhibition Park, Canberra comes alive in a riot of colour and sound. An A-list of National and International musicians perform daily across 18 venues featuring styles as diverse as acoustic, blues, roots, world, folk and country.

In a "choose your own adventure" scenario the ticket structure offers patrons the freedom to explore the Festival's many attractions catching the big acts, discovering the Festival's intimate spaces, wandering the markets or





Nariel Creek Folk Festival

The Nariel Creek Folk Festival is a celebration of traditional folk music, song and dance, with a focus on the Nariel old time style of Australian traditional music and dance. The festival has been an ongoing event since 1963 making it the longest running folk festival in Australia, and one of the oldest in the world. Some of the longer term festival goers refer to it as the "musicians" festival. The festival is generally an informal affair, held on the



banks of the Nariel Creek at the Nariel recreation reserve, from 27th December to 3rd January, although many people arrive earlier and depart later than this.

Where? The festival site is approximately 10 klometres to the west of Corryong in north-east Victoria. Corryong is located 437 km north-east of Melbourne via the Hume Freeway and Murray Valley Highway, 116 km east of Wodonga. Access from NSW is via either Thredbo and Khancoban or Tumut and Tumbarumba to



When .The festival runs from December 27th to January 3rd

Please note that the dates for the festival & dances are the same every year – it's just the days of the week that change.

Who? In addition to the small organised pro-

gramme, there are many campfire sessions every night that attract some top performances including sessions of traditional Irish, Scottish, and Australian music and song.
