Never been? Why not think about joining us next January.

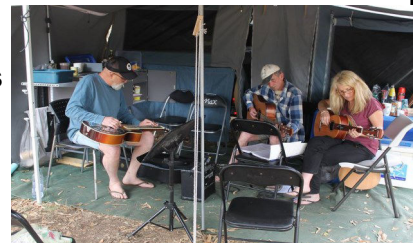

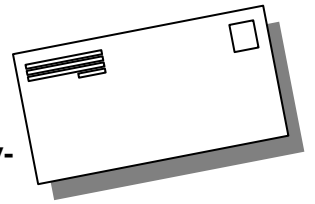

Uranquinty Folk Festival is a small, family-orientated festival, 12 kilometres south of Wagga Wagga southern NSW. Formed in 1970 by the Wagga Wagga Folk society, it is one of Australia's oldest folk festivals.



The Nariel Creek Folk Festival is a celebration of traditional folk music, song and dance and is held on the banks of the beautiful Nariel Creek in the Nariel Recreation Reserve. The event has been held since the early sixties, making it one of the longest running folk festivals in Australia. The artists are not paid, and the event is a not-for-profit community event. Experience musical performances around the campfire and attend the blackboard concert on New Years Day. There will also be a series of old time dances held in the Cudgewa Hall. The Festival is a great family-

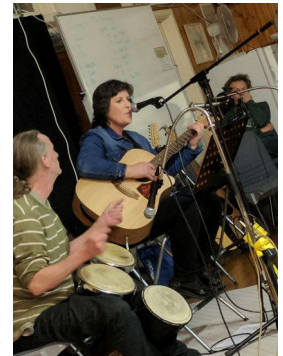

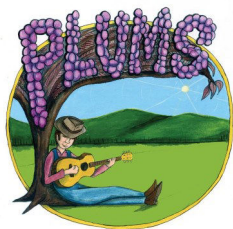

Admission to the Open Mic session is \$3 & includes Tea, Coffee, Biccies.

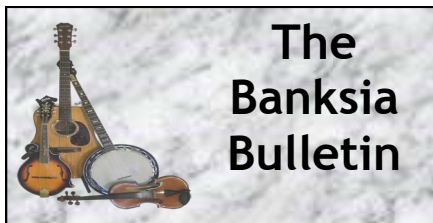
