The entertainment is non-stop and ranges from Tim and Debbie impersonations to a good old jam session.

All the artists performing are members of the club and occasionally there are also guest artists.

Next Sunday, 17 February, Rick E Vengeance, 3RRR disc jockey, will be playing guitar and singing.

The club is a non-profit organisation and the fastest growing folk club in Melbourne.

Already plans are under way for a bush dance on Sunday 17 March and the club's ultimate ambition is to hold a folk festival.
