WHAT ARE OTHER CLUBS/VENUES UP TO?

From Steve Bullock..VICTORIAN FOLK MUSIC CLUB, RINGWOOD

You are probably aware that the VFMC moved to Zoom based activities around June/July for what was anticipated to be a short, interim period. We are still at it!

We are currently running sessions every Tuesday evening (free), and ticketed concerts each 2nd Tuesday to give our performers some income. These are proving very successful both around Australia and internationally. We will be meeting early in January to discuss the issues involved in re-opening our hall based sessions. There are several organisational and logistical requirements that we need to resolve before we can set a re-start date. That date will be as soon as we can get our plans in order. A couple of things are very clear:

- 1. Although Zoom has kept us going, there is great desire to make music together.
- 2. Perhaps because we are based on an older demographic, there is also some reluctance to rush back to meeting in the hall.
- 3. We will almost certainly continue to provide a Zoom option from our hall based sessions for some time to come.

The dance side of our activity has also moved to Zoom. Our dance callers have worked hard, and with great success, to adapt traditional dances to be danceable by individuals or couples in isolation. The sessions have been so popular that we increased from monthly, first Saturday, to twice monthly on 1st and 3rd Saturdays. We see the resumption of dances in the hall as much more challenging than concerts and sessions, and don't expect to see it happen before March or April.

CRANBOURNE FUN NIGHT.. We were considering reopening but continuing with an online component for those unable to mix. However, with the recent changes we may need to continue online for a few months. Will keep you posted.
