

PFC President's Report

I must start this report with a huge thank you to Max Amos for his time at the helm of the PFC. He left the club with a fantastic committee, money in the bank, great equipment, a mandolin group (started by Max and now run by Mark Pottinger), a fiddle group (started and run by Barry Larkin), a PFC choir (started and run by Eric van Cuylenburg), a very well-attended jam session and a stable venue for the PFC at the Frankston Bowls Club.

Our club nights have been impacted by the Covid pandemic throughout the past two years. Some nights were cancelled and on one occasion we ran an open-air jam session in the Frankston Botanical Gardens just so that our members could attend with a much-reduced risk of getting Covid. I am not aware of any Covid transmission that has



resulted from our club nights at this stage, though I do know that many of our club members have had Covid, myself included. Triple-vaxed status has seemed to reduce the very nasty symptoms that have led some to hospital, long Covid effects and death. For me it was just three days of a very runny nose and lots of sneezing. I am fine now.

Our club nights are now back to normal. We were very glad to be able, finally, to have Suzette Herft perform as our guest artist in June. We had to cancel several club nights over the past year where Suzette was booked. I would like to recognize the contribution made by Peter Bucci in managing the bookings for the blackboard concerts. He did a great job for several years but has needed to step back from this role to pursue his other love - prospecting. I have taken over this role.

Our PFC members have been out and about, visiting other folk clubs and venues on a regular basis - Yamala Open Mike night, Girgarre Moosic Festival, Fathers In The Chapel, Hastings Monday Musos, Cranbourne FUN Night, BAD Folk, The Dubliner's Irish Session, McDaids Irish Session, The PFC Jam Weekend, The VFMC and the National Folk Festival in Canberra. Our club is known and well respected throughout the folk community here in Victoria.

We have IMHO one of the best club newsletters due to the untiring efforts of Peter Stanley. In our newsletter we promote other clubs and folk music venues, making it a valuable resource for finding out what is happening out there. I am certain that there are many who find it very valuable. Michael Creighton runs a community radio show, and he reminds me to thank Peter for the newsletter every time I see him.

We have made the change to our food arrangements, making it BYO. I haven't heard any grumbles about that. It is how we used to run our nights back in the early days except that it was BYO everything. We at least can get a drink at the bar.

The door fee has been put up from \$5 to \$7 for members and \$8 to \$10 for non-members. It has been a very long time since the entry charge has changed, but we have reached the point, with increased insurance costs among other price rises, where it became necessary. This is still one of the cheapest entries of its type anywhere in the state. Mentioning money reminds me that I have to thank Beth Perry for her continuing service to the PFC as Treasurer. Beth has been an essential part of the team that ensures the ongoing survival of our club. We are now getting into the technological age with the Square system enabling us to accept credit card payments. We are now able to manage payments and au-thorizations for outgoings through our phones. The payment is entered for approval by the treasurer and then authorised by either the President or the Secretary of the PFC. This saves a great deal of travel and time for everyone. a great deal of travel and time for everyone.

I must thank our hosts, the Frankston Bowls Club. We appreciate the lovely facilities provided at their club and the things they have done to facilitate our successful club nights. They have also been very accommodating when, on rare occasions, we have run a little bit late. We also appreciate the donation of a bottle of wine each month for our raffle.

The PFC was started 38 years ago, and it makes me very proud that it is still around so many years later and it still provides the members with easy regular access to live folk music. I thank all our hardworking committee members for their enthusiastic help in setting up and packing up at club nights and other PFC events, attending meetings and all the behind-thescenes stuff they do. They are the reason that everything runs so smoothly.


folk songs and musical style from attending the Gippsland Acoustic Music Club's monthly events and folk festivals as a teenager.
