
SUNDAY 4th JUNE.. OUR ANNUAL SONGWRITER'S CONTEST

Rules and Conditions for our Songwriters Competition 2023

1. Entry is free

2. The song, both tune and words, must be an original written in the folk genre by the entrant and must have been composed within the last 12 calendar months prior to the Competition date

3. The songwriter does not have to perform the song written but can nominate another person to perform it on their behalf..

4. As this is a Songwriting Contest, performance will be by ONE voice and ONE acoustic instrument. It is permissible to have two people performing the song. Any acoustic instrument can be used to present the song, the only exception is that an electric keyboard is allowed, in piano mode only with no effects or pre-recorded sound

5. (a) Persons intending to enter should contact Barry Larkin on 0418 363 056 or b_larkin@aapt.net.au to obtain an entry number and to provide name, phone number and email address.

5. (b) A copy of the song's words plus an audio or video recording of the song (MP3 or MP4) must be emailed to Barry Larkin by 15th of May

6. All entrants will be advised if they have or have not made the final 10 7. The Peninsula Folk Club has the right to refuse any entry on the basis that the content is, in the opinion of the committee, unsuitable.

8. The Judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into..!!

Notes: The audio recording does not have to be of professional quality. A home recording done with a computer and free software such as Audacity should give satisfactory results.

Peninsula Folk Club's "Junction Jam"

Will be held at Yarra Junction's historic Camp Eureka from Friday March 24th to Sunday March 26th.

(Enter from 9.00am Friday – Leave by 2.00pm Sunday).

Camp in your tent, caravan, car, swag, or in one of the many huts scattered around the grounds (you'll need to call Evan on 0439 456 544 if you want a hut). Camp on your own or in a group with your mates, and do remember to be "Covid Safe".

With the minimum of formality you can take part in as much, or as little, in jams, workshops, etc. There will also be a "Whiteboard" concert on Saturday arvo!

You will need to be fully vaxed, and self-cater as far as food is concerned (kitchen use is limited) – note that there are some wonderful eateries just minutes away. There are shower and toilet facilities on-site, but be aware that the camp is a "bush" camp! Remember also please to take your rubbish home with you. Come for the weekend, or just the day, no booking required (with the exception of hut accommodation), pay on arrival –

Caledonia is a modern Scottish <u>folk ballad</u> written by <u>Dougie MacLean</u> in 1977. The chorus of the song features the lyric "<u>Caledonia</u>, you're calling me, and now I'm going home",the term "Caledonia" itself being a <u>Latin</u> word for Scotland. "Caledonia" has been covered by various artists, and is often dubbed Scotland's "unofficial national anthem "

CALEDONIA


