

MALDON FOLK FESTIVAL 3rd-6th NOVEMBER



Our 2022 was brilliant, and now we look forward to another great festival in 2023 and welcome you back to our town.

Maldon Folk Festival, located in Central Victoria, has been held annually for more than four decades. Experience the legendary festival atmosphere, showcasing an abundance of music, and dance in the historic, Na-



tional Trust Classified Maldon township.
Each year we provide a long weekend of quality folk, bluegrass, a little jazz, and a little blues music, and dance and interactive workshops at affordable prices, to suit all age groups. All venues are walking distance from the centre of town and have access for people with a disability.

GUILDFORD BANJO JAMBOREE September 15 - 17 2023

Established in 2004 to highlight the banjo, its styles and related instruments.

Traditionally the emphasis has been on American string band music (bluegrass,

old-time, Appalachian, jug band, Hawaiian and blues) but more recently the program has expanded to encompasses other styles such as Celtic, Klezmer, Jazz and contemporary music.

The heart of the Jamboree is the camaraderie experienced by playing music with old and new friends in various spots around the town and it is that experience that has people returning year after year.

The program includes concerts, workshops, a children's session, a Gospel singalong, a bush dance, and various sessions around the town.


EDITOR'S SONG OF THE MONTH LOCH LOMOND Traditional Scottish

WHAT IS IT ALL ABOUT ??... HERE ARE TWO QUITE DIFFERENT EXPLANATIONS.. TAKE YOUR PICK

Firstly... Loch Lomond is a traditional Scottish folksong, in which the singer reminisces about the beauty of the famous loch just north of Glasgow and how he and his lover used to meet there. Alas, he rues, those meetings will never happen again

Secondly...."Loch Lomond" tells the story of two Scottish soldiers who were imprisoned after the famous Battle of Culloden Moor. One of them was to be executed, while the other was to be set free. According to Celtic legend if someone dies in a foreign land, his spirit will travel to his homeland by "the low road" - the route for the souls of the dead. In the song, the spirit of the dead soldier shall arrive first, while the living soldier will take the "high road" over the mountains, to arrive afterwards.

The song is from the point of view of the soldier who will be executed: When he sings, "ye'll tak' the high road and I'll tak' the low road" in effect he is saying that you will return alive, and I will return in spirit. He remembers his happy past, "By yon bonnie banks ... where me and my true love were ever wont to gae [accustomed to go]" and sadly accepts his death "the broken heart it ken nae [knows no] second Spring again."

15th Sept "Bones" McKINNON 'Goin' Back' is the debut album from independent Gippsland artist Bones Mackinnon offering a diverse collection of songs celebrating the complexity, and the simplicity of life. Not easily slotted into a single genre, the album shimmies between coun-

try, rock, folk and pop, travelling along a dusty road from tender ballads to rowdier numbers that get feet tapping.

Bones (Pauline) Mackinnon, Australian writer, teacher, and singer, began working with acclaimed songwriter, Charles Jenkins in 2019. What started out as Charles mentoring Bones in songwriting, soon developed into a productive collaboration spanning over 3 years. With husband Greg Mackinnon, Bones fine-tuned some of the arrangements, and took them to producer Douglas Lee Robertson.
