

National Bluegrass champions and five-time Golden Guitar Winners, the Davidson Brothers are best known for their high powered pickin, fine vocal harmonies, classic humour and sharing their love of music, which transcends to the audience each time they take the stage. Described as "Simply world class", the Davidson Brothers, recently inducted into the Australian Country Music Hall Fame - Hands of Fame monument in Tamworth (2017), have created an iconic contemporary acoustic bluegrass sound and continue to breakdown boundaries as musicians and entertainers of the highest order.


