FEB 2nd. GUEST ACT.. Tim and the Captain

Tim Ireland and Captain Ian Green have been involved in various music projects as performers, facilitators and educators for many years, combining their collective talents and musical history a decade ago. The result is a uniquely Australian folk/roots duo that blends original compositions and

story telling with the timeless narratives of Tim's ancestors - acclaimed late 19th century Goldfield poets Tam Rattray and Isa.

Tim is a master guitarist and soulful vocalist steeped in the blues while infusing his love of country, folk, and Appalachian/ Piedmont traditions. As a song writer, Tim is continuing his family tradition of painting rich, heartfelt images in words that demand attention.

Captain Ian Green brings a distinctive flair to their performance. His harmonica skills channel the spirit of traditional blues duos but adding styles and cross harp techniques as well as ukulele to add



character and depth to the stories being told. Tim and the Captain dedicate much of their time to running the <u>All Stars Choir</u> project. This incredible program creates the opportunity for people with physical, intellectual and multiple disabilities to participate in making music in a live band setting. Their work with the choir shines through in their duo show with a clear passion for sharing the joy of making music with others.

As an Irish- Australian, Maria Forde has always straddled both sides of her heritage in her songwriting. Incorporating the sweet melodies, that are the trademark of the Irish musical heritage, with observations of Australia, along with her personal experiences, Maria has blossomed into one of Australia's premier songwriters. Her first album - "Will You Dance With Me?" - features the title song, written for a friend's wedding, that has become a theme for weddings, in Australia and internationally, by Maria's original and various cover versions. The trend, in Maria's writing, to incorporate both her Irish origins and Australian sensibilities, are heralded by "Waltzing Matilda, My Darling" - a song about the torn spirits of the immigrant to both their country of birth and their adopted




land, Australia. Her sophomore release, "Dark Island" like the title, exhibited noir attitudes, as Maria broached topics such as child abuse, the innocence of childhood, and family relationships.

Like all good songwriters her lyrics often reflect an understanding of, and compassion for the human condition, with all it's triumphs and disasters, all it's bright peaks and dark corners. At her live performances she presents her songs with sincerity, passion and more than a dash of humour, and these very human attributes, along with her fine singing voice, is why she invariably establishes such a seemingly effortless rapport with her audiences....

John Flanagan is known for his authentic stage presence, heart-gripping storytelling and uplifting performances. He has been described as "one of Australia's finest lyricists"




Recently, John has been touring with a band celebrating

BURNING BRIDGES Tuesday 28th January The Burning Bridges are an old-school family string band with a constantly evolving repertoire that reaches back to the bedrock of American country music, including old time Appalachian fiddle tunes, alt-country, bluegrass, and an expanding catalogue of classic-sounding original songs and tunes written by all three members of the family. The Burning Bridges appear regularly at national folk and bluegrass festivals and at venues of distinction across Victoria and beyond, and have released three albums to date, the most recent, Whipporwill, in 2023.

Members include Peter Somerville (banjo/ guitar/ vocals), Fran Martin (guitar/ vocals), and award-winning young fiddle maestro Tom Somerville (fiddle/ guitar). Wunderkind Justin Vilchez joins the band on mandolin and guitar, and Andrew Le Blanc features on bull fiddle.
